## 9. New Business

a) Storm Water in Azilda – Azilda members weren't present. Deferred

b) **Storm Water at Minnow Lake and Ramsey Lake-** Discussion of the implications of the intended reconstruction of Second Ave. with resulting runoff of salt in the storm sewers. The City staff decided on a five lane intersection. This involved the tripling of the surfaces area and ditches became storm pipes. Motion for the GSWA to support the Minnow Lake group and send a letter to the City detailing its concern over salt in storm water following reconstruction as the City intends. Moved by David Furino and seconded by Margaret McLaughlin.

c) Hutchinson Report- Response Lilly Noble spoke on the problems of applying the Hutchinson recommended guidelines for lakes on the PreCambrian shield. The Hutchinson model doesn't apply well to the Sudbury area lakes. In discussion with Lilly the GSWA gave a motion to write to the City .A vote was made YES: 13 NO: 3 ABSTAIN: 3 CARRIED

MOTION- that GSWA does not support the use of the Hutchinson Model to decide lake capacity due to the lake of confidence in the modelled results. It is recommended by the MOE that the Interior model be used when the MOE Lake Capacity model doesn't work. We suggest the consideration of a mixed model proposed by CLS. GSWA would like to discuss this further with the City.
