1. Review of Meeting with SDHU

- a. An exploratory meeting to find out if and how SDHU could participate
- **b.** Committee members came away with very different impressions/memories of what SDHU would require to participate
 - Richard Auld suggested there wouldn't be many septic systems leaching into the environment so this could be manageable, but covering repairs would require a greater commitment
 - Do we need to allow for a contract person & travel allowance
 - Will SDHU human resource concerns be a show stopper
 - Need to develop our proposal in a way that relies very little on SDHU
 - Let SDHU decide if and how they will participate

2. Roundtable Discussion

a. Focus of Project

- Using a City of Sudbury map of "Addresses not Within 50m of Municipal Water or Wastewater" – involves 15 to 20% of Sudbury addresses – approximately 10,000 sewage systems
- Could just focus on septic tank pump-outs
- Offer 50% rebate on pump-outs
- Could just focus on membership lakes and rivers, or ones that have had blue-green algae blooms and/or have phosphorus issues
- Concerns expressed about limiting to only member lakes
- Important to be fair, open and equal opportunity
- Already focused on systems within 200 to 300 meters of a water body
- Should focus on high risk systems that have the greatest impact on watershed
- Volunteer participation

b. Funding

- Need a strong, focused and fair program
- Would approach the City of Sudbury to fund a portion of the project
- Is Council likely to support it if we only focus on GSWA member lakes
- Could eventually be a line item if it is a strong, open and fair program
- OTF funds projects that benefit the community and have measurable results
- OTF would not fund a project geared only towards GSWA members

c. Contractors

- Need to collaborate with pump-out contractors
- Find out if they would be willing to
 - Promote our program
 - Complete a pump-out form
 - Suggest applying to our program for volunteer septic replacement

- d. Survey
 - Survey the public/members to see if and how they might participate
 - Would a 50% rebate on septic pump-outs, or \$5,000 towards a septic replacement encourage their volunteer participation
 - Concerns were raised about the value of a survey
 - Tendency would be to want to take advantage of a grant, but would people actually follow through when seriously considering the total cost of a septic replacement that could cost \$20,000
 - Survey could
 - Provide a general idea of number of people interested in the program
 - Raise an awareness and provide feedback on our ideas
 - Provide a good foundation for project grant funding

e. Mailing Lists

- Sending notices only by email leaves many people out of the opportunity
- Snail mail will require a substantial commitment of dollars but would reach more people
- Could advertise in newspapers and email notice

3. Action Items:

- 1. Lin and Lilly will work on a survey and circulate it to committee members for their input.
- **2.** Lin will enquire with CAs at upcoming meeting regarding the Huron County model.
- 3. Lin will look into contractor pump-out licencing requirements.
- **4. Melanie** will provide Margaret with a pump-out form used in their previous Stewardship Program.
- 5. Margaret will contact pump-out contractors to enquire about their protocol and whether they would work with us to promote our program.
- 6. Margaret will also contact Nick Benkovich to find out when the bio-solids plant will be completed.
- **7. Richard** will contact Krista Carre to see how he can get a digital version of the "Addresses Not Within 50m of Municipal Water or Wastewater" map
- 8. Linda will clarify details of human resources issues with SDHU, and ask for their input on 26 February 2015 Meeting Notes.
