#### VIII. <u>New Business</u>

1. Stop the Spread Media Event – Thurs June 23 10:00 – 12:00 am at Ramsey Lk. Boat launch, Ramsey Lk. Road

- Joint City/GSWA group decided proposed Penage Lk. site was considered too far to attract all the media

- Anne Labranche, Lake Water Quality Field Work Intern for the City of Greater Sudbury, will try to arrange a demonstration power spray and a boat to illustrate to the invited media proper cleaning of boats to prevent spread of invasive species.

- Stephen Monet, the city's Manager of Environmental Planning Initiatives will arrange through the city departments to invite the media. Also, he will be available for the media on site

- All are urged to come out and support this event. Bring ribbons, cards, signs, tables

2. AIS Signs – Invasive species metal signs to encourage cleaning of boats prior to launching

- Signs are provided by the City.
- City will erect signs on City-owned boat launch properties
- Lake stewardships can apply (before June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2016) to get signs for private land
- Go through Anne Labranche at the City to order signs... Margaret McLaughlin will deliver signs
- The joint committee wants the signs facing the water ... and prefer them in high traffic areas
- GSWA has previously voted to pay for the posts Cost per sign of the posts was \$71.17
- (Note: The price has risen to \$81.62 in late August, 2016! And pipes and rivets were often unavailable)
- Send/give the receipt to Margaret or David Young for reimbursement for the cost of the posts
- The city will want something signed, and the signs must be up by 2 months.
- Lake association logos will not be put on the sign, but you can place your own lake sign at the bottom
- Some Instruction/Suggestions for Assembling Signs:
  - Only place to buy posts seems to be NEDCO, 1785 Frobisher St., located off of Falconbridge Rd.
  - Need a 10 foot post and a 3 foot post. They are called "Telespar Posts'
  - -The 10 foot post fits inside the 3 foot base post

- Use 4 connectors called drive rivets and 2 rivet washers for each sign that you put up. Or you can just use bolts.

- 2 rivets at a corner hold the pipes together. The signs need 2 rivets with washers.

- These rivets and washers were available free from the City's Sign Shop, located just down the street from NEDCO. Call the City at 311 and ask to be relayed to the sign shop. Ask really nice. They do not know about GSWA, but will know about the boat launch signs. The Sign Shop can be found by entering the driveway on the **south** side of Frobisher Street across the street from a sign that says "Parking For Regional Municipal Employees Only..." just before the piles of sand. Then thread your way past asphalt that is covered with streaks of road marking paint. You'll see old discarded signs by the shop.

- The installation of our signs is the same you see at city stop signs. Attach the sign to the 10 foot pole. The 3 footer pipe goes in to the ground by 2 feet or more and the 10 foot pole goes into the first pole by 6 to 8 inches. People suggested that the smaller pole can be hit, but it is easier to just dig a hole first. The smaller pole might get filled with sand, preventing the larger pole from fitting in.
