
Water and Waste Water

Waste water Stewardship Reports

A review of these reports shows that there were 61 by-pass events in 2014. Of these, 19 occurrences were termed major. For example a particularly major event occurred on October 15, 2014 when 325,058 cubic metres of raw sewage was released into Junction Creek with only partial disinfection.
